# **GUNYA EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT OUTREACH UPDATE**

The Mayoral Urban Renewal Programme (MURP) have allocated an amount of R687 000.00 to the Early Childhood Development (ECD) Outreach project for promotion of ECD, training of ECD practitioners and caregivers, as well as childcare and nutrition. The project covers Harare area in Khayelitsha, Gunya and Lotus Park. The Extended Public Works Programme (EPWP), a government funded, temporary work programme that provides poverty and income relief, have appointed 25 fieldworkers for the project.

### **GUNYA ALCOHOL HARMS REDUCTION: UPDATE**

The Alcohol Harms Reduction strategy aims to reduce alcohol-related harms In targeted areas in the Western Cape such as car accidents, violence, and damage to property as a result of alcohol. Three pilot areas for implementation of the Alcohol Harms Reduction strategy have been confirmed in Gunya - Hlazo Village, Lusaka and KTC. 28 Community NHW members have been selected to form part of the Alcohol Harms Reduction strategy. Baseline data collection activities began in December 2015, including an audit of liquor outlets in the community.

Ten Gunya Community NHW members received Grade E & D Security Training from Department of Community Safety (DoCS), with the rest of qualifying Community NHW members to receive training in the course of February 2016.

## **UPCOMING EVENTS AND PROJECTS** FEBRUARY - MARCH 2016

On 21 March 2016, a Human Rights Commemoration event has been organised by the Nyanga Community Policing Forum (CPF) in partnership with a variety of stakeholders.

The event will take place at the corner of New Eisleben and Govan Mbeki Roads.

The venue of the event is symbolic, as it shall positively occupy a problematic space that is considered as a crime hotspot.

# 2015 FESTIVE SEASON NEIGHBOUR-**HOOD WATCH DEPLOYMENT**

 $6^{\rm 0}$  Community Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) members (20 in Gugulethu and 40 in Nyanga) were deployed in crime hotspots throughout Gunya over the Festive Season from the 15th of December to the 3rd of January (21 days). The feedback received was that the visibility of Community NHW members gave a sense of security for community members and really brought about safety and security in Gunya over the Festive Season.



### **GUNYA ALCOHOL** HARMS REDUCTION: **COMMUNITY NEWS UPDATE**

The Ward 39 Alcohol Harms Reduction Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) team was deployed on 2 December 2015 under the leadership of Bongani Msindo (33 years old), who is a youth leader from Hlazo Village. The NHW team are based in the Lusaka Hall in one of Councillor Khaya Yozi's offices, which is a generous offer from the leadership.

One of the team's first tasks was to complete a cellphone app-based audit of liquor outlets in this ward and to inform residents of the project through a door-to-door campaign visit. The team also received an interim patrolling uniform of caps and t-shirts to start the process.

On 20 December 2015, the team was devastated to find out about the death of their leader Msindo, who died of a stab wound while stopping a fight in his community. A wellattended memorial service was held at Hlazo Hall on 30 December.
